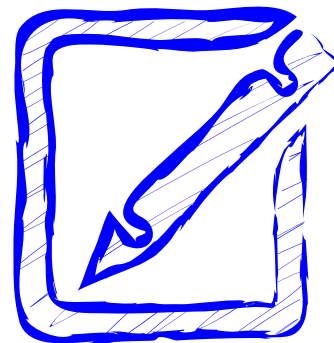

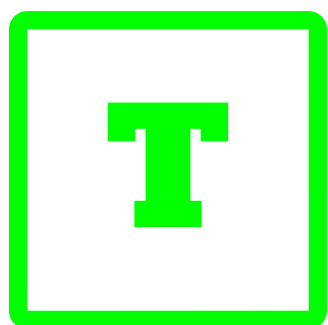

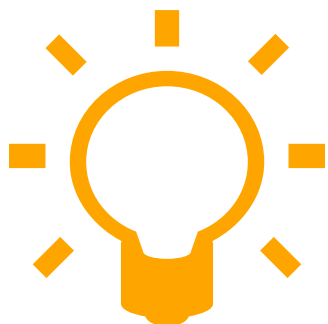

Simon Says Speech Bubble: Add additional relevant information into your notes based on what Ms. Simon says during lecture. Draw the speech bubble with an "S" inside of it in the left-hand column and the info across in the right-hand column. Highlight in PINK. (Minimum 2 per set of notes)



Textbook Block: Add relevant additional information into your notes that you gather from the textbook. Draw a square with a "T" inside of it in the left-hand column and the info across in the right-hand column. Put your info in quotation marks and cite the page number on which you found it. Highlight in GREEN. (Minimum 2 per set of notes)



Light Bulb: In your notes include connections by answering the short prompts found in the lecture presentation. Draw the light bulb in the left-hand column and your connections in the right-hand column. Highlight in ORANGE. (Minimum 2 per set of notes)

Write each key term in the left-hand column and its corresponding definition across in the right-hand column. Highlight in YELLOW.
