10. Does the paper integrate the use of sources by making connections between the sources to establish that the perspectives are “in conversation” with one another or does it read like a list of sources that have little to no connection between sources?

11. Does the argument synthesize information from various sources or is it more of a summary?

12. What does the writer need to do to improve synthesis?

13. Does the writer include evaluation of the credibility and relevance of the sources?
 - List (pg # and paragraph #) any places where this is needed.

14. Does the essay CONVINCINGLY link claims (assertions) and evidence and include insights (explanation/significance)?

23. List any sources listed on the Works Cited that were not cited in the paper.

24. Are the in-text citations cited correctly using MLA format?

25. Is the Works Cited page in alphabetical order, in MLA format?

26. Mark any spelling/convention errors you notice.

27. Make diction suggestions.

- (Diction: choice of words especially with regard to correctness, clearness, or effectiveness)

28. Read for syntax/fluency. List any places where fluency needs to be improved.

- (Syntax: the arrangement of words and phrases to create well-formed sentences in a language)
- (Fluency: writing needs to flow smoothly from word to word, phrase to phrase, and sentence to sentence)

29. Are the sentences varied?

30. Are quotes embedded nicely in the sentences?
